

**The Texas A&M University System  
State Grant Awards Paid From  
Funds Appropriated by the General Appropriations Act**

House Bill 1487, 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, requires state agencies and institutions of higher education that award a state grant in an amount greater than \$25,000 from funds appropriated through the General Appropriations Act (GAA) to publish the purpose for which the grant was awarded on the agency’s public website effective September 1, 2013. (Reference section 403.0245, Texas Government Code) This document provides a list of such awards for agencies included in the Texas A&M University System.

- **Texas A&M Forest Service**
