Subject: New online course: Clery Act Guidelines for A&M System Campus Security Authorities

Dear A&M System Training Coordinators,

I would like to let you know that *Clery Act Guidelines for A&M System Campus Security Authorities* training is now available in TrainTraq (course no. [2111844](#)). This online course provides guidance to university employees who are considered Campus Security Authorities (CSAs) under the Jeanne Clery Campus Security Policy & Campus Crime Statistics Act (Clery). It summarizes Clery crime reporting requirements, explains CSA crime reporting responsibilities, and emphasizes the CSA's role in campus safety. The training consists of a slide presentation followed by a 10-question quiz, and should take about 20-30 minutes to complete. The content was provided by University Risk & Compliance at Texas A&M University, and we have worked with the System Ethics and Compliance Office to modify the course so that it can be used by all A&M System universities.

Note that there will be some content changes in the near future resulting from the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2013. Please work with your Compliance Officer to determine who (if anyone) needs to be assigned this course and when to begin making assignments. If you need to develop assignment rules, please let me know.
